Overview

The role is a general one with work being undertaking in all areas of the club marine department whilst working as part of a small team.

Main Responsibilities

- Drive the plant machinery
- Drive the mooring ferry.
- Assist with all other marine duties of maintaining the fleet, launching and recovery of RIBs and Elites.
- Assist with the launching, recovery and winter lay-up of Yachts
- Maintain the HISC fleet of dinghies and powered craft to a high standard.
- Play a key role with the winter maintenance programme. Inc, anti-fouling, GRP and other physical maintainer jobs with chemicals and machinery.
- To help plan, organise and run training/fun weeks.
- To provide briefings and de-briefings for sailors and instructors.
- To be the lead instructor on Dinghy and Powerboat courses.
- Plan, advertise, organise and run beginner and improver training sessions at weekends and evenings for youth and adult members.
- Support Thursday Club the HISC sailing charity acting as SI if required.
- Provide and maintain on shore resources particularly for use when sailing not possible. E.g. training DVD's, rules guides, ropes for knot practice. Devise on-shore activities.
- Within reason, anything else required from the marine management team.
