Overview

The Marine Technician is a versatile role that will be part of a team responsible for the smooth running of the Marine Department as well as being a key support role for the Marine Manager & Assistant Marine Manager. The role will entail supporting the club to club activity and major sailing events, ensuring the club equipment to a full working order. You will also assist race teams and instructors in the launching and recovery of boats. You will need a high attention to detail and be able to prioritise tasks. When working you will be expected to undertake some heavy physical work. Training to drive plant machinery will be provided. Flexible and Weekend working are part of the role.

Main Responsibilities

- To provide assistance to HISC members as required.
- To keep the Rescue, Committee and Ferry boats clean and up to full inventory.
- To keep the Rescue, Committee and Ferry boats fuelled.
- To assist with the maintenance programmes for all the sailing club's boats.
- To assist with the maintenance of all marine equipment.
- To rig, launch and pack away hire boats/boards from the HISC hire fleet.
- To deliver Sailing Instruction if qualified when required.
- To help with the winter layup and launch of yachts, committee boats and ferry.
- Monitor and maintain the inventory in all the sailing club boats- Safety kits, flags, horns and course boards.
- To support race events with the correct equipment e.g. race marks, flags.
- Assist with the running of the ferryboat and other boat driving duties.
- To Launch and recover Club and private rib, club ventures and keelboats.
- To drive club plant machinery to complete launch and recovery operations.
- Complete maintenance checks, fill in maintenance logs in line with the club policy.
- To help monitor the dinghy park.
- To maintain clean and safe working areas, inside the boat shed and the yard.
- Within reason, anything else required from the marine management team
